AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF
Certain Employees in the Town of Hammonton

BE IT ORDAINED by Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Hammonton, County of Atlantic, New Jersey the salaries, clothing allowance, education stipend, health insurance buyout, sick time, vacation time, personal time, comp time, holidays and overtime shall apply to members for contract terms commencing January 1, 2018 per Town Code and per individual bargaining unit Contracts. Public Hearing of Ordinance #040-2018 –Amending Chapter 147 Flood Plan

Ordinance #40-2018

AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING CHAPTER 147 OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON

SECTION I

§147-3(B), the following definitions are added:

Floodplain Management Regulations – Zoning ordinances, subdivision regulations, building codes, health regulations, special purpose ordinances (such as a Floodplain ordinance, grading ordinance and erosion control ordinance) and other applications of police power. The term describes such State or local regulations, in any combination thereof, which provides standards for the purpose of flood damage prevention and reduction.

Historic Structure – Any structure that is:
Listed individually in the National Register of Historic Places (a listing maintained by the Department of Interior) or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as meeting the requirements for individual listing on the National Register;
Certified or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as contributing to the historical significance of a registered historic district or a district preliminarily determined by the Secretary to qualify as a registered historic district;
Individually listed on a State inventory of historic places in States with historic preservation programs which have been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; or
Individually listed on a local inventory of historic places and communities with historic preservation programs that have been certified either:
By an approved State program as determined by the Secretary of Interior; or
Directly by the Secretary of the Interior in States without approved programs.

New Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision – A manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including at a minimum, the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed on or after the effective date of the floodplain management regulations adopted by the municipality.

Substantial Damage – Damage of any origin sustained by a structure whereby the cost of restoring the structure to its condition before damage would equal or exceed fifty percent (50%) of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

§147-3(B), the following definitions are amended:

Area of Shallow Flooding – A designated AO Zone on the Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (DFIRM) with a one percent annual or greater chance of flooding to an average depth of one to three feet where a clearly defined channel does not exist, where the path of flooding is unpredictable and where velocity flow may be evident. Such flooding is characterized by ponding or sheet flow.

Base Flood – A flood having a one percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year.

Development – Any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or drilling operations or storage of materials located within the area of special flood hazard.

The term “Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM)” is changed to “Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (DFIRM)” and the definition shall remain the same.

Flood Insurance Study – The official report provided in which the Federal Insurance Administration has provided flood profiles, as well as the Flood Insurance Map(s) and the water surface elevation of the base flood.

New Construction – Structures for which the start of construction commenced on or after the effective date of a floodplain regulation adopted by the Town of Hammonton and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures.

Start of Construction – (For other than new construction or substantial improvements under the Coastal Barrier Resources Act (P.L. No. 97-348)) includes substantial improvements and means the date the building permit was issued, provided the actual start of construction, repair, reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, placement, or other improvement was within 180 days of the permit date. The actual start means either the first placement of permanent construction of a structure on a site such as the pouring of a slab or footings, the installation of pilings, the construction of columns, or any work beyond the stage of excavation, or the placement of a manufactured home on a foundation. Permanent construction does not include land preparation, such as clearing, grading and filling; nor does it include the installation of streets and/or walkways; nor does it include excavation of a basement, footings, piers or foundations or the erection of temporary forms; nor does it include the installation on the property of accessory buildings, such as garages or sheds not occupied as dwelling units or not part of the main structure. For a substantial improvement, the actual start of construction means the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of a building, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the building.

§147-6, first sentence, the term “re-located in” is changed to “re-located to”.

§147-17(D)(4) is changed to read as follows:

(4) Base flood elevation data shall be provided for subdivision proposals and other proposed new development which contains at least fifty (50) lots or five (5) acres (whichever is less).

A Section 147-18(C) is added which states as follows:

C. In all areas of special flood hazard in which base flood elevation data has been provided and no floodway has been designated, the accumulative effect of any proposed development, when combined with all other existing and anticipated development, shall not increase the water surface elevation of the base flood more than two-tenths (0.2) of a foot at any point.

SECTION III

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION IV

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION V

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

1. Boyer Avenue, Possible Frog Rock Golf Course Acquisition (ARH #2018.0564):

As authorized by the Town, ARH Representatives and the Town Conflict Solicitor attended a meeting at the Pinelands Commission on Thursday, September 13, 2018. We have provided a summary of the file review to the Conflict Solicitor and Town Council for information purposes and for considerations for further action if desired.

Also, in conjunction with the work requested by the Town which ARH has already completed related research, reports, maps, on-site investigation meeting attendance, etc. for both the Boyer Avenue Land Disposal site and the Frog Rock Golf Course site an invoice has been submitted to the Town for payment consideration. The invoice covers the time spent through September 9, 2018.

Utility Action Items

4. NJ Water Quality Accountability Act (ARH #2018-0656):

Earlier this year, the Town received a notice listing requirements established by the New Jersey Water Quality Accountability Act (WQAA). ARH Associates has been completing this work for a number of municipalities. We have briefly discussed WQAA requirements with the Municipal Utilities Department (MUD) Superintendent and will coordinate with him to develop a proposal to establish a PILOT program for GPS location and mapping of hydrants, valves and other utility attributes (one part of the WQAA) for the Town's consideration.

In developing the PILOT program, we will take advantage of existing data, locations, and mapping, and will utilize web-based/mobile GIS applications and operational dashboards to assist operational staff with field inspection, maintenance, and reporting requirements. Upon completion of the PILOT program, we will be able to design and price full-scale implementation for the Town's water system and other utilities, if desired. Possibly some of the future costs for collection may be reimbursable through NJEIT funding.

ARH will review the requirements and costs with the PWTC and the MUD Superintendent for Compliance with the act is required by April, 2019.
