PWM REPORT

Lakeview Gardens Well Testing and Potential for Public Water Extension

We have been in contact with the NJDEP related to the Lakeview Gardens area. The Mayor and Council will have a public information session at the November Council meeting to update the public on their recommendations. If you have not completed a water test of your private well, please complete that test ASAP for the PFAS compounds, and provide the Town with a copy of those results.

NJDOT Transportation Alternatives (Set-Aside) Program

The Town and the Hammonton public school district have worked with Triad and TDG to complete an application for funding consideration to construct a pedestrian/bicycle path along Linda Avenue from Fairview Avenue to a point just past the Cedar Branch stream crossing. The request also includes similar improvements between Linda Avenue and Liberty Street. The application will be filed by Triad by the November 3rd deadline date. The funding request is for 1.39 million dollars. A resolution of support for the project application is listed for approval on the Council agenda.

Boyer Avenue Land Application Site Overland Drip Irrigation Pinelands Application

The Town received a Pinelands Commission approval on 10/14 for expansion of the overland drip irrigation component at the Boyer Avenue site. The Town has contracted with Lee Rain, Inc. to complete this work which should start later this year. The improvements will provide a more efficient, even distribution of treated effluent at the Boyer Avenue site.

Water Allocation

As authorized, Ray Ferrara attended a recent Pinelands Commission meeting associated with water allocation restrictions for wells that withdraw water from the Kirkwood Cohancey aquifer. The Town representatives will be meeting with Ray Ferrara and ARH to formulate a response to the Pinelands Commission related to the proposed regulations which are due by November 5, 2022.

West End Avenue Townhouse Development Conceptual Plan

The Town and developer have met onsite and had various conversations related to finalizing the project agreement between the Town and the developer including utility locations, roadway width, improvements, curb line, tree removal, etc. The remaining items for this agreement wording have been finalized between the Town and developer's attorney. Appropriate action by the Council should be considered related to the agreement. The developer could proceed now to prepare the project design plans and seek approvals from the various agencies.

Town Public Works Schedule

Introduction of Bond Ordinance 021-2022 - Recreation - 11th Street - Bike Path and Old Forks Road

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS 2022 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, BY AND IN THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$2,030,000 THEREFOR (INCLUDING STATE OF NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANTS TOTALING \$1,310,000) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$684,000 IN BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWN TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF **BE IT ORDAINED** AND ENACTED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements or purposes to be undertaken by the Town of Hammonton, in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey (the "Town"). For the said improvements or purposes stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the aggregate sum of \$2,030,000, which sum includes grants in the amounts of \$265,000, \$745,000 and \$300,000, respectively, expected to be received from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation (the "265,000 DOT Grant", the "745,000 DOT Grant" and the \$300,000 DOT Grant" and sometimes hereinafter referred to as the "DOT Grants"), and \$36,000 as the aggregate amount of down payments for said improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"). The down payments are now available by virtue of a provision or provisions in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Town for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof and to meet the part of said \$2,030,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of the DOT Grants and said down payments, negotiable bonds of the Town are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$684,000 pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by, the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the Town in a principal amount not exceeding \$684,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by application of the Town in a principal amount not exceeding \$684,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by, the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, include, but are not limited to, as follows:

(b) The above improvements and purposes set forth in Section 3(a) shall also include, as applicable, surveying, construction planning, engineering and design work, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents, construction inspection and contract administration, environmental testing and remediation and also all work, materials, equipment, labor and appurtenances as necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

(c) The aggregate estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said improvements or purposes is \$684,000.

(d) The aggregate estimated cost of said improvements or purposes is \$2,030,000, the excess amount thereof over the said DOT Grants and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, is the aggregate down payments for said purposes in the amount of \$36,000.

SECTION 4. Except for the DOT Grants, in the event the United States of America, the State of New Jersey and/or the County of Atlantic make a contribution or grant in aid to the Town for the improvements and purposes authorized hereby and the same shall be received by the Town prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then the amount of such bonds or notes to be issued shall be reduced by the amount so received from the United States of America, the State of New Jersey and/or the County of Atlantic. Except for the DOT Grants, in the event, however, that any amount so contributed or granted by the United States of America, the State of New Jersey and/or the County of Atlantic. Except for the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then such funds shall be received by the Town after the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then such funds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds or notes so issued and shall be used for no other purpose. This Section 4 shall not apply, however, with respect to any contribution or grant in aid received by the Town as a result of using funds from this bond ordinance as "matching local funds" to receive such contribution or grant in aid.

SECTION 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Town (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The Town hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable, for the Town. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Town is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget of the Town, a revised capital or temporary capital budget for the Town has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are improvements or purposes which the Town may lawfully undertake as general improvements or purposes, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of said improvements or purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 14.44 years.

(c) The supplemental debt statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Town and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Town as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds or notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$684,000 and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$406,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the improvements or purposes herein before described.

SECTION 8. The full faith and credit of the Town are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Town, and the Town shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Town for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 9. The Town reasonably expects to reimburse any expenditures toward the costs of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes. No funds from sources other than the bonds or notes authorized herein have been or are reasonably expected to be reserved, allocated on a long-term basis or otherwise set aside by the Town, or any member of the same "Controlled Group" as the Town, within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-1(e), pursuant to its budget or financial policies with respect to any expenditures to be reimbursed. This Section 9 is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the Town's official intent to reimburse any expenditures toward the costs of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof to be incurred and paid prior to the issuance of bonds or notes authorized herein in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 10. The Town covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under section 103(a) of the Code of the interest on all bonds and notes issued under this ordinance.

SECTION 11. The Chief Financial Officer of the Town is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Town and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Town. The Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into an appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Town pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Town and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Town fails to comply with its undertaking, the Town shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

SECTION 12. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication hereof after final adoption and approval by the Mayor, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Resolution #139-2022 – Hire Police Officer under Senate Bill #3672

AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON TO HIRE POLICE OFFICERS FOR EMPLOYMENT UNDER SENATE BILL NO. 3672.

WHEREAS, The Town of Hammonton, Atlantic County, State of New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as the Town) is a jurisdiction governed by Title 11A and the regulations and rules established under Title 4A of the Administrative Code, and

WHEREAS, the Hammonton Police Department may hire individuals as police officers who may or may not have taken an open competitive examination for the title of police officers under the provisions of Senate Bill 3672; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 3672 allows for individuals hired under the legislation to be hired as a provisional entry-level police officers, to an entry level law enforcement officers upon completion of the Full Basic Course for Police Officer Training within 9 months of a provisional entry-level appointment by the Town of Hammonton; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Hammonton has duly established in writing, policies governing nepotism and governing conflicts of interest; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Hammonton has also adopted a similar "Opt In" Provision in 2021 under Hammonton Ordinance #009-2021; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Hammonton believes that "Opting In" to this program is in the interest of efficiency, expediency, diversity and promotes safety within the Town of Hammonton; and

WHEREAS, the "Opt In" provision shall remain valid until changed by a rescinding resolution of the governing body or revised state statute.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, this 24th day of October 2022, by the governing body of the Town of Hammonton, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey authorizes the resolution a copy of which shall be transmitted to the New Jersey Civil Service Commission.
